PROCEEDING: ZOOM STATUS CONFERENCE

Counsel for both parties are present *via* Zoom videoconference and identified for the record.

This is the first status conference.

Discovery is being provided.

The Government anticipates filing a motion for a Protective Order and may be pursuing additional charges.

Estimated length of trial: 3 days.

Defense counsel believes there is an issue the Magistrate Judge overlooked and he expects to file a motion to reopen the detention hearing based on that new evidence. If the Magistrate Judge denies the request, counsel may be filing an amended motion for this Court to reconsider the Magistrate Judge's denial of the request to reopen the detention hearing.

The defendant requests a two-cycle continuance.

The Government does not object to the request for a continuance.

For the reasons articulated on the record, the defendant's oral motion for a continuance is Granted. The Court finds, pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §3161(h)(7)(A), that the ends of justice served by the granting of such continuance outweigh the best interests of the public and the defendant in a speedy trial; and the period of delay resulting from this continuance shall be excludable.

A Zoom status conference is set for January 19, 2022 at 9:00 A.M.
