PROCEEDING: ZOOM STATUS CONFERENCE

Counsel is present *via* Zoom video conference and identified for the record.

The Magistrate Judge orally denied Defendant's Motion for Reconsideration of Defendant's Motion for Pretrial Release (Doc. 49).

A continued hearing on Defendant's Emergency Motion to Prevent Dissipation of Assets Reserved for CJA Reimbursement (Doc. 80) is scheduled for today before the Magistrate Judge.

The Government's Motion for a Protective Order Regarding Discovery (Doc. 74) is also still pending.

The United States contemplates filing a Superseding Indictment.

Defense counsel anticipates filing a motion to suppress the weapons.

Estimated length of trial on the current weapons charges: 3 days (Government) and 2 days (Defendant).

The defendant requests a two-cycle continuance.

The Government does not object to the request for a continuance.

For the reasons articulated on the record, the defendant's oral motion for a continuance is Granted. The Court finds, pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §3161(h)(7)(A), that the ends of justice served by the granting of such continuance outweigh the best interests of the public and the defendant in a speedy trial; and the period of delay resulting from this continuance shall be excludable.
