ORDER

Upon consideration of Defendant's motion for an order of the Court directing the Correctional Treatment Facility to allow Defendant to review Rule 16 discovery materials, Dkt. 22, and the government's response, Dkt. 23, it is hereby **ORDERED** that the motion is **GRANTED**. The Court recognizes that the facility is likely facing challenges in facilitating the review of large volumes of discovery materials by numerous defendants associated with the events at the Capitol on January 6, 2021. But the Court also finds that here, given that the Court entered the Protective Order in this case more than two months ago, *see* Dkt. 14, it is in the interest of justice for the facility to provide Defendant with the relevant Rule 16 materials as soon as practicable, consistent with the rights of other defendants. In light of the foregoing, it is hereby **ORDERED** that the Correctional Treatment Facility shall permit Defendant to begin

reviewing Rule 16 discovery materials on or before June 30, 2021, and that the facility shall provide Defendant with 40 hours or more in which to review those materials.
