This matter having come before the Court on motions by Defendant Patrick Stedman; the Court having considered the written submissions of the parties regarding such motions, and oral argument (if any), and for good cause shown,

ORDERED that:

1. Defendants motions to dismiss Counts One, Two and Three of the Indictment are GRANTED and therefore Counts One, Two and Three of the Indictment are DISMISSED;
2. The defendant's motion to preclude the government from presenting evidence at trial regarding any events of January 6, 2021 for which it cannot demonstrate Mr. Stedman was present and observed is GRANTED;
3. Defendant's motion to permit (1) a questionnaire to be sent to summoned prospective jurors, after review and approval by the Court, (2) the right for the parties to be present during any pre-screening questioning the Court conducts before formal voir dire, (3) individual questioning during voir dire, and (4) expanded peremptory challenges to allow the defendant 20 such challenges, is GRANTED.
