**NOTICE**

Following entry of the Judgment in this matter, the Court is now advised that Defendant Samuel Fisher is barred from participating in the New York Temporary Release Program unless “the sentencing authority has submitted, in writing, that there is no objection to the inmate’s participation in temporary release programs.” NY Comp. Codes R. & Regs. tit. 7, § 1900.4(c)(7)(ii)(b). Accordingly, the Court supplies this written notice that the Court has no objection to, and in fact supports, the Defendant’s participation in temporary release programs. To the extent that the Judgment otherwise renders the Defendant ineligible for temporary release programs, including through the imposition of a federal criminal detainer, the Court further states that no portion of the Judgment was intended to have that effect.

Should this written notice prove insufficient to establish the Defendant’s eligibility for temporary release programs insofar as eligibility is affected by the Judgment in this matter, the Defendant is encouraged to notify the Court and seek appropriate further relief.
