**JOINT MOTION TO EXCLUDE TIME UNDER THE SPEEDY TRIAL ACT**

The United States, through undersigned counsel, and Tyler Bensch, through his undersigned counsel, hereby file this joint motion exclude time under the Speedy Trial Act for the reasons discussed below.

A criminal complaint was filed on August 16, 2022, in case number 1:22-MJ-184-RMM, charging the defendant with Civil Disorder, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 231(a)(3), and Entering and Remaining in a Restricted Building or Grounds, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1752(a)(1). The defendant made an initial appearance in this District on August 30, 2022. Consent motions to vacate status hearing and exclude time were filed and granted. 22-MJ-184-RMM, ECF Nos. 48, 54, 59, 67, 73, 77, and 80. Time under the Speedy Trial Act is currently excluded through June 1, 2023, the date that the next status hearing had been scheduled before the Magistrate Judge. *See* ECF 80.

On May 19, 2023, the United States filed an Information charging the defendant with two counts, namely, Disorderly and Disruptive Conduct in a Restricted Building or Grounds, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1752(a)(2), and Theft of Government Property, in violation of 18 U.S.C. §§ 641, and 2. ECF No. 81.

On May 30, 2023, after discussion with the parties, the Court scheduled the arraignment and an anticipated plea hearing to be held on June 23, 2023, at 3:30 p.m. The parties now request that the Court exclude the time from June 1, 2023, until June 23, 2023, pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 3161 *et seq.*, on the basis that the ends of justice served by taking such actions outweigh the best interest of the public and the defendant in a speedy trial pursuant to the factors described in 18 U.S.C. § 3161(h)(7)(A).
