ORDER

On July 2, 2021, Magistrate Judge G. Michael Harvey ordered the defendant Fi Duong released on personal recognizance, subject to 24-hour home confinement, GPS monitoring, and other conditions. See Order Setting Conditions of Release [Dkt. No. 8]. Before the Court is Mr. Duong’s Motion to Modify Conditions of Release (“Motion”) [Dkt. No. 25]. Mr. Duong requests that this Court allow him to leave his home to take his son to the bus stop each morning, and to pick his son up from the bus stop each afternoon. Motion at 1. Mr. Duong estimates that he will leave his home each morning from 8:10 a.m. to 8:30 a.m., and each afternoon from either 12:25 p.m. to 12:45 p.m. or 4:10 p.m. to 4:25 p.m., depending on whether his son has a half-day or a full-day of school. Id. The government opposes this motion and the Pretrial Services Office takes no position. Id. at 2. The Court concludes that this modification is reasonable. Accordingly, it is hereby

ORDERED that Mr. Duong’s Motion to Modify Conditions of Release [Dkt. No. 25] is GRANTED; it is

FURTHER ORDERED that Mr. Duong shall be permitted to leave his home, on school days, to take his son to the bus stop each morning and to pick his son up from the bus stop

each afternoon, between the approximate time frames of 8:10 a.m. to 8:30 a.m., and either 12:25 p.m. to 12:45 p.m. or 4:10 p.m. to 4:25 p.m., depending on whether his son has a half-day or a full-day of school; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED that all other conditions set on July 2, 2021, shall remain in full force and effect.
