THIRD UNOPPOSED MOTION TO EXTEND MOTIONS AND CORRESPONDING DEADLINES

Defendant, Bradley Wayne Weeks, by and through undersigned counsel and pursuant to Fed.R.Cim.P. 45(b) hereby moves this Honorable Court for its Order further extending the motions, oppositions and replies deadline in this case for six (6) days, making any motions due Thursday, June 23, 2022, with corresponding extensions of the deadlines for oppositions and replies. In support thereof, Defendant states:

- 1. The Court previously extended the motions deadline in this case to June 17, 2022, with a deadline for oppositions July 1, 2022 and a deadline for replies due July 11, 2022. (Dkt. 39)
- 2. Undersigned counsel has been diligently working on a motion to dismiss Count One of the Indictment, however, other responsibilities have interfered with his completion of the motion. In addition to additional

responsibilities undersigned counsel has had to assume following his partner's recent passing, undersigned counsel had an emergency surface in that a client experienced a mental health breakdown while in custody, necessitating counsel ot have to immediately tend to that matter in order to have the client released from iail to a psychiatric hospital. Additionally, undersigned counsel represents Plaintiffs in the matter of Falls, et al. v. DeSantis, et al., Case No.: 4:22-cv-00166-MW-MJF, currently pending before the Honorable Mark E. Walker in the United States District Court for the Northern District of Florida. Such case was filed to enjoin enforcement of recent legislation restricting teachers' and employers' ability to discuss matters pertaining to race, sex and other topics with their students and employees, referred to by Governor DeSantis as the "Stop WOKE Act." Such matter is set for a hearing on Plaintiff's Motion for Preliminary Injunction this coming Tuesday, June 21, 2022. Plaintiffs' reply in the case was due this past Wednesday, June 15, 2020. Undersigned counsel has had to dedicate more time to that matter than originally anticipated, depriving him of the ability to complete motions in this case.

3. Fed.R.Cim.P. 45(b)(1)(A) provides: "When an act must or may be done within a specified period, the court on its own may extend the time, or for good cause may do so on a party's motion made: before the originally prescribed or previously extended time expires...."

4. Undersigned counsel has conferred with Assistant United States

Attorney Jamie Carter and Anne Veldhuis and is authorized to represent that the

Government does not oppose the relief requested herein.

WHEREFORE, Defendant respectfully requests this Honorable Court extend the motion deadline in this cause for a period of six (6) days, making motions due on or before June 23, 2022, oppositions due July 7, 2022 and replies due July 25, 2022.
