ORDER

On May 17, 2021, Magistrate Judge Zia M. Faruqui ordered defendant Antionne De Shaun Brodnax released on personal recognizance, subject to conditions. See Order Setting Conditions of Release (“Order”) [Dkt. No. 11], as modified by Order [Dkt. No. 27], and as further modified by Order [Dkt. No. 45]. On March 19, 2022, Mr. Brodnax was rearrested for possession of a controlled substance, driving under the influence, failure to maintain lane, and open container in a motor vehicle. See Pretrial Services Agency for the District of Columbia Memorandum (“Pretrial Services Report”) [Dkt. No. 46] at 2.

In light of Mr. Brodnax’s rearrest, the Pretrial Services Agency for the District of Columbia and the U.S. Probation Office for the Northern District of Georgia jointly recommend that Mr. Brodnax’s conditions of release “be modified to now include substance abuse evaluation and treatment if recommended, submit to substance abuse testing, and not use alcohol at all.” Pretrial Services Report at 2. Mr. Brodnax does not object to the proposed modification, and the government concurs with the recommendation. See Defendant’s Response to Proposed Modification to Conditions of Release [Dkt. No. 48]; Government’s Response to Pretrial Violation Report [Dkt. No. 49]. The Court concludes that the proposed modifications to Mr.

Brodnax's conditions of release are appropriate and the "least restrictive . . . [to] reasonably assure the appearance of [Mr. Brodnax] as required and the safety of any other person and the community." 18 U.S.C. §§ 3142(c)(1)(B), 3143(a)(1). Accordingly, it is hereby

ORDERED that Mr. Brodnax's conditions of release are amended to include the following additional conditions: Mr. Brodnax shall not use alcohol at all; he shall submit to testing for prohibited substances as directed by the pretrial services office or supervising officer; and he shall participate in substance abuse evaluation and treatment as directed by the pretrial services office or supervising officer.
