**MOTION TO CONTINUE PRETRIAL MOTIONS AND NOTICES**

AND NOW, this 24th day of March 2022, comes the Defendant Timothy Hale-Cusanelli, by and through his attorney Jonathan W. Crisp, Esquire, and hereby requests this Honorable Court grant his Motion to Continue Pretrial Motions and Notices. In support of said motion, the following is averred:

1. The Defendant was indicted on 29 January 2021, and charged with the following:
  - a) Count 1: Civil Disorder;<sup>1</sup>
  - b) Count 2: Aiding and Abetting<sup>2</sup>
  - c) Count 3: Obstruction of an Official Proceeding;<sup>3</sup>
  - d) Count 4: Entering and Remaining in a Restricted Building or Grounds;<sup>4</sup>
  - e) Count 5: Impeding Ingress and Egress in a Restricted Building or Grounds;<sup>5</sup>

f) Count 6: Disorderly Conduct in a Capitol Building;<sup>6</sup>

g) Count 7: Parading, Demonstrating, or Picketing in a Capitol Building;<sup>7</sup>

2. Defendant entered a plea of not guilty on all counts on 23 March 2021.
3. On 1 June 2021, Attorney Jonathan Zucker, Esq. withdrew from this matter.
4. On 21 June 2021, Attorney Jonathan W. Crisp, Esq. was appointed as counsel for Defendant.
5. Jury Selection and Trial is currently scheduled for 23 May 2022.
6. Motions in Limine, Motions to Suppress, and Notices for experts are due 25 March 2022.
7. Undersigned counsel is in need of additional time to review the evidence and prepare these motions and notices.
8. Therefore, undersigned counsel respectfully requests a continuance of three (3) days to file motions in limine, motions to suppress, and notices of experts. The requested deadline would be 28 March 2022.
9. Assistant United States Attorney Kathryn Fifield, Esquire, and Assistant United States Attorney Karen Seifert, Esquire concurs with the instant motion.
10. Under the Speedy Trial Act, delay resulting from any pretrial motion, from the filing of the motion through the conclusion of the hearing, or other prompt

disposition of such motion, shall be excluded in computing the time within which trial must be commenced. See 18 U.S.C. § 3161(h)(1)(D).

In accordance with Local Rule LCvR 16.1(b), notice has been given to all other parties in this matter. In accordance with Local Rule LCvR 7(a), no brief is being submitted in support of this motion because it is a motion for continuance of pretrial motions and notices with the reasons for the motion fully set forth.
