STANDARD CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION

As part of your probation, you must comply with the following standard conditions of supervision. These conditions are imposed because they establish the basic expectations for your behavior while on supervision and identify the minimum tools needed by probation officers to keep informed, report to the court about, and bring about improvements in your conduct and condition.

- You must report to the probation office in the federal judicial district where you are authorized to reside within 72 hours of the time you were sentenced, unless the probation officer instructs you to report to a different probation office or within a different time frame.
- After initially reporting to the probation office, you will receive instructions from the court or the probation officer about how and when you must report to the probation officer, and you must report to the probation officer as instructed.
- You must not knowingly leave the federal judicial district where you are authorized to reside without first getting permission from the court or the probation officer.

You must answer truthfully the questions asked by your probation officer. 4.

You must live at a place approved by the probation officer. If you plan to change where you live or anything about your living arrangements (such as the people you live with), you must notify the probation officer at least 10 days before the change. If notifying the probation officer in advance is not possible due to unanticipated circumstances, you must notify the probation officer within 72 hours of becoming aware of a change or expected change.

You must allow the probation officer to visit you at any time at your home or elsewhere, and you must permit the probation officer to

take any items prohibited by the conditions of your supervision that he or she observes in plain view.

- You must work full time (at least 30 hours per week) at a lawful type of employment, unless the probation officer excuses you from doing so. If you do not have full-time employment you must try to find full-time employment, unless the probation officer excuses you from doing so. If you plan to change where you work or anything about your work (such as your position or your job responsibilities), you must notify the probation officer at least 10 days before the change. If notifying the probation officer at least 10 days in advance is not possible due to unanticipated circumstances, you must notify the probation officer within 72 hours of becoming aware of a change or expected change.
- You must not communicate or interact with someone you know is engaged in criminal activity. If you know someone has been convicted of a felony, you must not knowingly communicate or interact with that person without first getting the permission of the probation officer.

If you are arrested or questioned by a law enforcement officer, you must notify the probation officer within 72 hours.

- 10. You must not own, possess, or have access to a firearm, ammunition, destructive device, or dangerous weapon (i.e., anything that was designed, or was modified for, the specific purpose of causing bodily injury or death to another person such as nunchakus or tasers).
- You must not act or make any agreement with a law enforcement agency to act as a confidential human source or informant without first getting the permission of the court.
- 12. If the probation officer determines that you pose a risk to another person (including an organization), the probation officer may require you to notify the person about the risk and you must comply with that instruction. The probation officer may contact the person and confirm that you have notified the person about the risk.
- 13. You must follow the instructions of the probation officer related to the conditions of supervision.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION

Employment - The defendant must maintain employment.

Location Monitoring - The defendant will be monitored by the form of location monitoring technology indicated herein for a period of sixty (60) days and he must follow the rules and regulations of the location monitoring program. The cost of the program is waived. Location monitoring technology at the discretion of the probation officer, including Radio Frequency (RF) Monitoring; GPS Monitoring (including hybrid GPS); SmartLINK; or voice recognition. This form of location monitoring technology will be used to monitor the following restriction on the defendant's movement in the community: the defendant is restricted to his residence at all times except for work, firefighting duties, his daughters' activities, religious services, medical and therapeutic appointments, and care for his grandmother. This schedule is to be determined by the Probation Office once they have obtained the verification of defendant's employment and the hours when he has these activities (Home Detention).

Restitution - The defendant must pay the \$500 restitution and the \$2,000 fine at a rate to be determined by the United States Probation Office. The defendant must provide the probation officer with any requested truthful financial information until such time as the amount has been paid in full. The United States Probation Office may share that information with the US Attorney's Office.

Substance Abuse Testing - The defendant must participate in any drug testing, including random drug testing, to determine if he has used a prohibited substance, including marijuana. The defendant must not attempt to obstruct or tamper with the testing methods.

Alcohol or Substance Abuse Assessment - The defendant must participate in and complete an alcohol or substance abuse assessment at the direction of the United States Probation Office, and participate in any substance abuse treatment that is indicated at the direction of and under the supervision of the United States Probation Office.

Mental Health Assessment - The defendant must participate in and complete a mental health assessment at the direction of the United States Probation Office and participate in any treatment that is indicated at the direction of and under the supervision of the United States Probation Office, which may include continuing with the treatment the the defendant has already begun with his current therapist. The defendant must execute any releases in order to enable the United States Probation Office to monitor compliance with this condition.

The Court will transfer the supervision, but not the jurisdiction, of Defendant's supervision to the United States Probation Office for the Middle District of Pennsylvania.
