### IMPRISONMENT

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### SUPERVISED RELEASE

Upon release from imprisonment, you will be on supervised release for a term of:

Twenty-four (24) months on Count Two (2s) of the Superseding Indictment. This will include ninety (90) days of location monitoring (home detention).

### MANDATORY CONDITIONS

1. You must not commit another federal, state or local crime.
2. You must not unlawfully possess a controlled substance.
3. You must refrain from any unlawful use of a controlled substance. You must submit to one drug test within 15 days of release from imprisonment and at least two periodic drug tests thereafter, as determined by the court.
  - The above drug testing condition is suspended, based on the court's determination that you pose a low risk of future substance abuse. *(check if applicable)*
4.  You must make restitution in accordance with 18 U.S.C. §§ 3663 and 3663A or any other statute authorizing a sentence of restitution. *(check if applicable)*
5.  You must cooperate in the collection of DNA as directed by the probation officer. *(check if applicable)*
6.  You must comply with the requirements of the Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act (34 U.S.C. § 20901, *et seq.*) as directed by the probation officer, the Bureau of Prisons, or any state sex offender registration agency in the location where you reside, work, are a student, or were convicted of a qualifying offense. *(check if applicable)*
7.  You must participate in an approved program for domestic violence. *(check if applicable)*

You must comply with the standard conditions that have been adopted by this court as well as with any other conditions on the attached page.

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### STANDARD CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION

As part of your supervised release, you must comply with the following standard conditions of supervision. These conditions are imposed because they establish the basic expectations for your behavior while on supervision and identify the minimum tools needed by probation officers to keep informed, report to the court about, and bring about improvements in your conduct and condition.

1. You must report to the probation office in the federal judicial district where you are authorized to reside within 72 hours of your release from imprisonment, unless the probation officer instructs you to report to a different probation office or within a different time frame.
2. After initially reporting to the probation office, you will receive instructions from the court or the probation officer about how and when you must report to the probation officer, and you must report to the probation officer as instructed.
3. You must not knowingly leave the federal judicial district where you are authorized to reside without first getting permission from the court or the probation officer.
4. You must answer truthfully the questions asked by your probation officer.
5. You must live at a place approved by the probation officer. If you plan to change where you live or anything about your living arrangements (such as the people you live with), you must notify the probation officer at least 10 days before the change. If notifying the probation officer in advance is not possible due to unanticipated circumstances, you must notify the probation officer within 72 hours of becoming aware of a change or expected change.
6. You must allow the probation officer to visit you at any time at your home or elsewhere, and you must permit the probation officer to take any items prohibited by the conditions of your supervision that he or she observes in plain view.
7. You must work full time (at least 30 hours per week) at a lawful type of employment, unless the probation officer excuses you from doing so. If you do not have full-time employment you must try to find full-time employment, unless the probation officer excuses you from doing so. If you plan to change where you work or anything about your work (such as your position or your job responsibilities), you must notify the probation officer at least 10 days before the change. If notifying the probation officer at least 10 days in advance is not possible due to unanticipated circumstances, you must notify the probation officer within 72 hours of becoming aware of a change or expected change.
8. You must not communicate or interact with someone you know is engaged in criminal activity. If you know someone has been convicted of a felony, you must not knowingly communicate or interact with that person without first getting the permission of the probation officer.
9. If you are arrested or questioned by a law enforcement officer, you must notify the probation officer within 72 hours.
10. You must not own, possess, or have access to a firearm, ammunition, destructive device, or dangerous weapon (i.e., anything that was designed, or was modified for, the specific purpose of causing bodily injury or death to another person such as nunchakus or tasers).
11. You must not act or make any agreement with a law enforcement agency to act as a confidential human source or informant without first getting the permission of the court.
12. If the probation officer determines that you pose a risk to another person (including an organization), the probation officer may require you to notify the person about the risk and you must comply with that instruction. The probation officer may contact the person and confirm that you have notified the person about the risk.
13. You must follow the instructions of the probation officer related to the conditions of supervision.

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### SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION

**DNA Sample Requirement** - Pursuant to 42 USC § 14135a, for all felony offenses, the defendant shall submit to the collection and use of DNA identification information while incarcerated in the Bureau of Prisons, or at the direction of the United States Probation Office.

**Location Monitoring** - The defendant must participate in the Location Monitoring (LM) program for a period of ninety (90) days, and she must follow all the rules, regulations and technology requirements of the program. The cost of the program is waived. As determined by the United States Probation Office the defendant may be required to maintain a telephone at her place of residence without any service that would interfere with the operation of the Location Monitoring (LM) equipment for the above period of time. At the discretion of the Probation Officer, unless otherwise ordered by the Court, the defendant may be required to wear a location monitoring device that may include: Radio Frequency (RF); Global Positioning Monitoring (including hybrid GPS) and/or Random Tracking. This form of location monitoring technology will be used to monitor the following restriction on the defendant's movement in the community. The defendant is restricted to her residence at all times except for employment; education; religious services; medical; substance abuse, or mental health treatment; attorney visits; court appearances; court-ordered obligations; or other activities as pre-approved by the United States Probation Officer, which the Court expects will include the defendant's childcare responsibilities.

**Financial Payment** - The defendant must pay the financial penalty in accordance with the Schedule of Payments sheet of the judgment. The defendant must also notify the Court of any changes in economic circumstances that might affect her ability to pay this financial penalty.

**Financial Payment Schedule** - Having assessed the defendant's ability to pay, payment of the total criminal monetary penalties is due as follows: Payment in equal monthly installments of \$100 a month for a period of 20 months to commence after the date of this judgment.

**Financial Information Disclosure** - The defendant must provide the probation officer access to any requested financial information and authorize the release of any financial information. The probation office may share financial information with the United States Attorney's Office.

**Financial Restrictions** - The defendant must not incur new credit charges, or open additional lines of credit without the approval of the probation officer.

**Substance Abuse Testing** - The defendant must submit to substance abuse testing to determine if she has used a prohibited substance. The defendant must not attempt to obstruct or tamper with the testing methods.

**Re-entry Progress Hearing** - Within forty-five (45) days of release from incarceration the defendant will appear before the Court for a re-entry progress hearing. The United States Probation Office in the district in which the defendant is supervised will submit a progress report to the Court within thirty (30) days of the commencement of supervision. Upon receipt of the progress report, the Court will determine if the defendant's appearance is required.
