**UNOPPOSED MOTION TO CONTINUE  
AND EXCLUDE TIME UNDER THE SPEEDY TRIAL ACT**

AARON JAMES MILEUR, by and through his counsel Eugene Ohm, Assistant Federal Public Defender for the District of Columbia, hereby files a Joint Motion to Continue the Status Hearing and Exclude Time under the Speedy Trial Act.

The parties are diligently working to prepare this case and produce and review discovery. Despite these efforts, the parties agree that additional time is needed for effective preparation of the case and that a continuance is needed to allow for adequate preparation in this unusual and complex case and to serve the interests of justice. 18 U.S.C. § 3161(h)(7)(A); (B)(i)(ii) and (iv). Moreover, defense counsel will be in trial before Judge Royce Lamberth. Judge Lamberth has informed parties that he intends to sit on Fridays.

Accordingly, Mr. Mileur requests that the Court continue the status hearing for approximately 30 to 45 days and to exclude that period of time from the computation of time within which trial must commence under the Speedy Trial Act. The government does not oppose this request.

CONCLUSION

For the foregoing reasons, the parties request that the Court order the parties to contact the Deputy Clerk to schedule a status hearing date in approximately 30 to 45 days.
