Up until the last few years i would average 2-3 jobs, raised my kids, never had any drug problems nor any problems with alcohol or even cigarettes. I help out neighbors and friend whenever possible whether it be pulling vehicles of a ditch or assisting people after they have struck a moose on the highway. Honestly Alaska presents a lot of opportunity to help those around you if your willing. I pay my taxes and haven't even received a traffic ticket in over 14 years.**

**My trip that started in December Of 2020 was supposed to be a trip of firsts... my first Christmas with my cousins family in Illinois, my first trip to Cancun, then Florida , and was supposed to end with a presidential inauguration in DC on January 20th. Of course I wanted my candidate to be able to figure out some way to win but either way my plan was to be there on the 20th. I changed my schedule up when Trumps potential last rally was announced and since I had never been to one I decided to attend. The goal was to attend the rally on the mall and continue onto some of the outdoor monuments being that covid restrictions had presumably shut down most of the museums.**

**Things would have turned out a lot differently had we arrived in DC on time, had my cousin not sprained her ankle coming off the train, had we not been approached by people informing us of an after rally at the Capital building just 2 blocks away. I had no prior notice of any events happening at the Capitol building that day. We were informed that the President would be do a rally behind the Capitol building on the House of Representatives side so that's where we waited for 2 hours before an approaching crowd seemingly walked right threw the police lines and proceeded to fill in the area between my waiting group and the Capitol building. Around the same time our barricades came down and with the larger crowd behind us we all voted to move forward. We didn't know why the police evacuated the area or why they fell back to the rotunda steps. We were there for hours peacefully waiting for the rally to start. There was no reason to go into the building that day, we weren't trying to go but when i approached the ONE office just inside the open door to ask if we were allowed to go in... the crowd behind my cousin and I pushed us in. After we were inside my cousins fiancé was**

*having a panic and was confused as to how we ended up inside since it happened so fast, while my cousin calmed him down I walked around the rotunda to see what was happening. I saw people running in the halls, papers flying, tear gas but not one officer. After about 2 minutes, I decided that we needed to leave so we made our way back out the way we came. After we got back outside we saw plenty of officers but none were doing anything to manage the situation. I've lived in Alaska for most of my life and rally's and protests are just not a thing up here but next time I will see some similar signs from what i saw on Jan 6th I will head the other way.*
