**CONSENT MOTION FOR A TWO-WEEK
EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE PRETRIAL MOTIONS**

Defendants, by and through undersigned counsel, do hereby request a two-week extension of time to file pretrial motions. In support thereof, defendants set forth as follows:

1. This is a complex, multiple count, multiple party indictment arising from the events of January 6, 2021.
2. Both defense counsel replaced original counsel. There was a delay in providing Rule 16 discovery to current defense counsel from original defense counsel.

3. Current counsel have been working with the Assistant U.S.

Attorneys assigned to this prosecution to exchange discovery. The parties are working to complete a transfer of all Rule 16 discovery in a timely manner. The parties expect this will be completed within the next week.

4. Defendants pretrial motions are currently due to be filed on May 29, 2023. Defendants seek an additional two weeks to June 12, 2023 to complete a review of discovery and to file the remaining pretrial motions. Defendants have no objection to the United States also receiving a two-week extension of time file pretrial motions and oppositions to defendants motions.

5. The United States consents to the granting of this Motion.

6. Defendants rely upon the discretionary powers of this Honorable Court in seeking the relief requested herein.

WHEREFORE, the foregoing considered, defendants prays this Honorable Court for a two-week extension of time to June 12, 2023 to file remaining pretrial motions.
