My name is Kayleen Hale. I am from Northern Michigan originally, and now, I live in Coeur D'Alene Idaho. I am a stay-at-home mom to one wonderful baby boy. I'm writing this letter on behalf of Luke Lints.

I have known Luke for about 5 or 6 years at this point. We were introduced by a mutual friend (Austin Fletcher) at Redeeming Grace Church. At this point, Luke was helping Redeeming Grace build their church, as well as helping the church with whatever it needed. He did this all voluntarily without pay. I do believe this is when he was homeless and he was staying in their temporary church building on a cot. At this time, he did not have a car, so he was relying on his bicycle or rides from other people. From my perspective, it appeared that the church took advantage of his giving nature. Though that is Luke, always looking for ways to help and people to love. Unfortunately, I have seen this characteristic taken advantage of many times. He goes out of his way to help friends or others in need. I have seen Luke help roof a friend's house and pray for other people in need. When he finally got a car he was always giving rides to people who needed them. When he started growing his gardens, he was always giving away fresh produce to anybody who needed it. Luke is the person that would stop to make sure somebody was okay. When I had my miscarriage, he gave me the biggest hug and said, if I ever needed to talk to anyone, he was always there for me.

I know that Luke had kind of a really difficult childhood. Normal things that most of us take for granted, as just progression in our lives, would be a huge step for him. Buying a car was a huge ordeal and he wasn't able to do it until his twenties. This step took a lot of encouragement from a mentor in Luke's life. I saw this as a huge growth in him. One of the things I have seen through my years of experience and friendship with Luke is that he is impressionable. When I first knew him, I saw other people take advantage of him. As our friendship continued, I saw Luke create a circle of people around him who had his best intentions at heart. With this healthy environment, I really saw a lot of improvements in his day-to-day life and who he is as a person. Luke was getting better jobs, following his dreams and starting his gardens, working on healing the traumas from his childhood, and learning how to create healthy boundaries. Even with all those improvements, Luke is still very impressionable.

Luke has the biggest heart and will always do what he thinks is right. Luke can get carried away by the people around him. Luke could be the type of person who will unintentionally do the wrong thing for the right reason, when he was talking to me about January 6th and what was going on. Luke expressed to me how much he was worried for the people around him. Luke wanted to make sure that everyone was safe and protected.

Your Honor, from My perspective, Luke was at the wrong place at the wrong time trying to do what he believed was right. Luke is a good guy that often gets taken advantage of by the people around him. I know his heart was in the right place and he was just trying to do what he believed was the right thing in a very high-intensity moment.
