VERDICT

For the reasons stated in the oral ruling on April 4, 2023, and based on the evidence presented at the bench trial, the Court finds as follows:

For **Count I** (ECF No. 16), Entering and Remaining in a Restricted Building, in violation

of 18 U.S.C. § 1752(a)(1), Defendants Jared Paul Cantrell and Quentin G. Cantrell are GUILTY.

For Count II, Disorderly and Disruptive Conduct in a Restricted Building, in violation of

18 U.S.C. § 1752(a)(2), Defendant Jared Paul Cantrell is GUILTY, and Defendant Quentin G.

Cantrell is **NOT GUILTY**.

For COUNT III, Disorderly or Disruptive Conduct in a U.S. Capitol Building or

Grounds, in violation of 40 U.S.C. § 5104(e)(2)(D), Defendants Jared Paul Cantrell and Quentin

G. Cantrell are **NOT GUILTY**.

For **Count IV**, Parading, Demonstrating, or Picketing in a Capitol Building, in violation of 40 U.S.C. § 5104(e)(2)(G), Defendants Jared Paul Cantrell and Quentin G. Cantrell are **GUILTY**.
