## JOINT MOTION TO CONTINUE STATUS HEARING AND TO EXCLUDE TIME UNDER THE SPEEDY TRIAL ACT

The parties hereby move this Court to continue the scheduled status hearing in the above-captioned proceeding, and further to exclude the time under the Speedy Trial Act, 18 U.S.C. § 3161 *et seq.*, on the basis that the ends of justice served by taking such actions outweigh the interest of the public and the defendant in a speedy trial pursuant to the factors described in 18 U.S.C. § 3161. In support of this motion, the parties state as follows:

- 1. Mr Ethridge is before the Court charged by Indictment with; Obstruction of an Official Proceeding in violation of 18 U.S.C. §1512(c)(2); Civil Disorder and Aiding and Abetting in violation of 18 U.S.C. §231(a)(3, 2; Entering and Remaining in a Restricted Building or Grounds in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1752(A)(1), Disorderly and Disruptive Conduct in a Restricted Building or Grounds in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1752 (a)(2), Disorderly Conduct in a Capitol Building in violation of 40 U.S.C. § 5104 (e)(2)(D), and Demonstrating or Picketing in a Capitol Building in violation of 40 U.S.C. § 5104 (e)(2)(G). A status hearing is currently set for Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> January 2023.
- 2. Counsel for the government, Michael Gordon, is currently in trial and is unable to be present at the current status. Additionally, the parties are engaged in discussions relating to

discovery issues and potential disposition options. These discussions are ongoing and the parties expect to come to a resolution shortly such that we can inform the Court, however this process will not be complete by the currently set status date.

- 3. The parties have discussed a new hearing date. Mr Gordon's trial will continue through the week of the 23<sup>rd</sup> January. Counsel for Mr Ethridge starts trial on 1<sup>st</sup> February. Thus the parties are requesting a date on the 31<sup>st</sup> January, 2023.
- 4. Mr Ethridge agrees that the time limits mandated by 18 U.S.C. § 3161 are tolled for the period between the current status hearing and the date agreed upon for the next hearing.

WHEREFORE, for the above reasons, the parties respectfully request that this Court grant this Joint Motion to Continue Status Hearing in the above-captioned proceeding.
