PROCEEDING: ZOOM STATUS CONFERENCE

Counsel is present *via* Zoom video conference and identified for the record.

A Superseding Indictment was filed on April 12, 2022.

The defendant filed a Motion for the Court to Conduct a *Faretta* Hearing (Doc. 162).

The defendant also filed a Motion to Allow Substitution of Counsel (Doc. 165).

Mr. Sansone addresses the Court.

Mr. Futerman addresses the Court.

Ms. Asokan addresses the Court.

For the reasons articulated on the record, Defendant's Motion for the Court to Conduct a *Faretta* Hearing (Doc. 162) is DENIED as moot and the Motion to Allow Substitution of Counsel (Doc. 165) is GRANTED. Attorney Roger Futerman is designated new counsel in this matter and William Sansone is relieved of all further responsibility in this case.

Further discussions are held.

The Government will file a motion regarding the security clearance.

Mr. Futerman requests a continuance.

For the reasons articulated on the record, the defendant's oral motion for a continuance is Granted. The Court finds, pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §3161(h)(7)(A), that the ends of justice served by the granting of such continuance outweigh the best interests of the public and the defendant in a speedy trial; and the period of delay resulting from this continuance shall be excludable.
